Neticueure Guidelines

In an online learning environment, it is important to establish netiquette guidelines and expectations for how to interact with each other. Please review these helpful tips.

Synchronous Netiquette

Be on time. Connect and log into the virtual session 10-15 minutes before the start time. Make sure that your internet connection, microphone and camera are working.
Be present. It is essential to participate in the virtual class from a quiet space or location. Make sure to be mindful of your background. Stay engaged while others are speaking using appropriate visual cues.

• **Be prepared to learn.** Make sure to dress appropriately. Have your course materials ready and consider taking notes. Use the chat feature to speak with the instructor.

• **Be considerate.** It is important to be polite and respectful, even if there are differences of opinion. Instructors will not tolerate inappropriate online behavior, profanity or offensive language.

• **Be respectful.** Remember that online communication lacks visual cues, be clear with your words. Don't make disagreements personal; focus on the content.

• **Be mindful.** Think before you post. Try to justify your ideas and opinions using a polite and objective tone.

• **Be professional.** Use proper language and proof-read; check all grammar and spelling. Remember to cite any quotes and references appropriately.

• **Be constructive.** Provide constructive feedback or comments. When you don't understand the response, ask clarifying questions.
